This award honours the memory of Morton Shulman who, through unorthodox methods, perseverance and innovative approaches to solving problems, achieved much in his life and helped people with Parkinson's and their families across Canada.

Parkinson Society Canada will accept written nominations for the 2012 award no later than **March 31st, 2012**. Subsequent nominations will be considered the following year. Who is eligible?

Any Canadian resident whose efforts are characterized by the following:

- Individual or systemic advocacy that results in either qualitative or quantitative benefits for people with Parkinson's and their families.
- Creative approach to achieving results.
- Efforts that do not always fit the "norm" of effecting change.

Selection Process

Completed nomination forms will be reviewed by a selection committee of Parkinson Society Canada. The committee may request additional information about nominees.

Form of the Award

Artists Ron and Linda Baird have created an original sculpture for permanent display at the Morton & Gloria Shulman Movement Disorder Centre. It is presently temporarily on display at the National Office of Parkinson Society Canada. A list of the names of those who have won the Award is part of the sculpture.

Nominations will be encouraged and a recipient determined by the selection committee annually.
